



The rules

Here are shortly the rules of the fairytale cache!

- Everyone is allowed to take part in the game!
- GPS devices can be lent at the tourist information office in the town hall.
- An identity card has to be paid as a forfeit per gadget. If the GPS gadget gets lost, it has to be replaced.
- GPS devices can only be lent by persons aged 16 or older.
- There will be a briefing of the GPS devices.
- All cache points are easily reachable by feet on the normal trails!



Hello dear Geocacher!

The forest is a mysterious world. Many fairytales or legends are set in forest. Just think at Snow White, Little Red Riding Hood, The wolf and the seven kids and Hansel and Gretel.

Some of these fairytales will encounter you now in form of riddles. This GPS rally now leads you to the empire of fairytales and legends.

Start is the town hall in Schramberg-Tennenbronn.
Enter the coordinates, which lead you to the first stop:

N48 11.424

E008 21.234

Here you have to look for the mascot “Schramboli”, who gives you a hint to the searched fairytale. Then you read the corresponding fairytale in the back of this booklet and so you can answer the question at stop 1 and get the coordinates for the next stop. There you proceed just the same and so you get to the finish anytime. If you don't get on with the solution at one stop, you can have a look on the last page for the right coordinates.


The Frog Prince
